The bo package is released for Baan IVc4. This document provides the steps you must complete to create the package and make it available in existing package combinations; before you install the PMC solution, these steps must be completed.

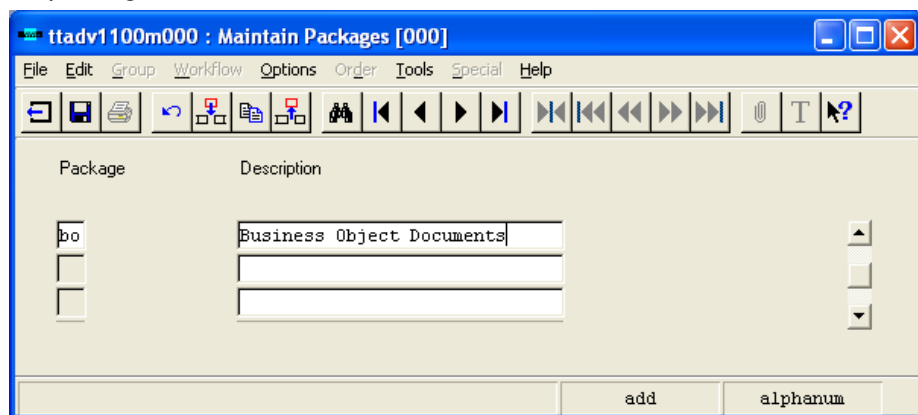
Adding bo Package to Package Combinations

To create a new package VRC and add it to package combinations, complete the following steps.

IMPORTANT: Before you install the PMC solution, complete the following steps.

- 1 Start the Maintain Packages (ttadv1100m000) session and add the new bo package, as shown here:



- 2 Start the Maintain Package VRC's (ttadv1111m000) session. Create a new VRC 2.0U b4 bo for the bo package. Set the status of the VRC to Released. An example of the new package VRC is as follows:

ttadv111m000 : Maintain Package VRC's [000]

- 3 Start the Maintain Directories of Software Components (ttadv1115m000) session and enter the directories for the VRC:

ttadv1115m000 : Maintain Directories of Software Components [000]

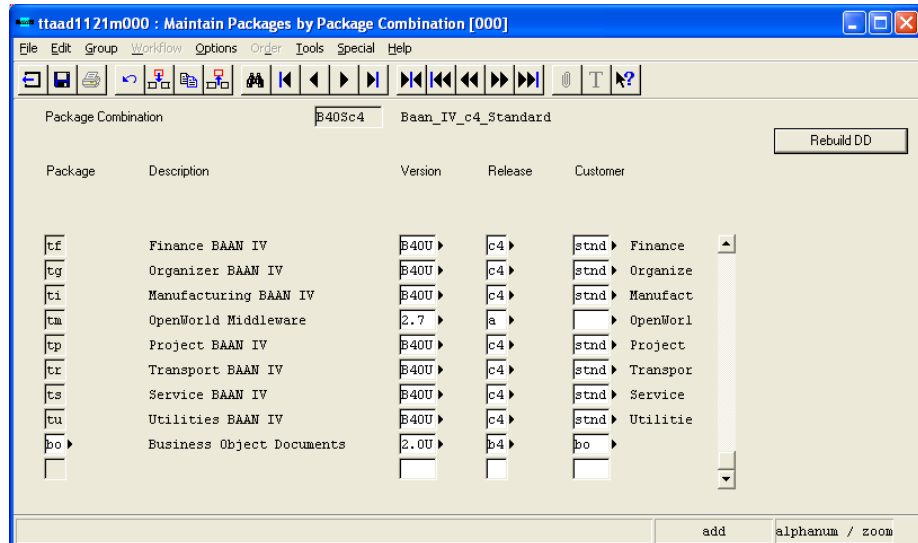

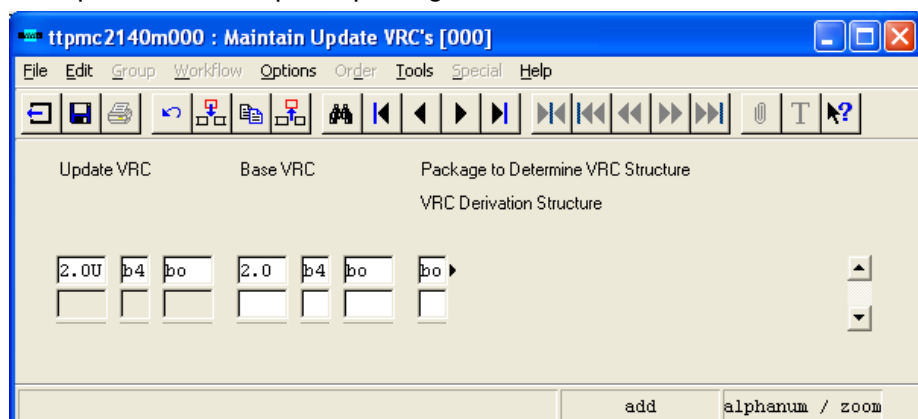

- 4 In the Maintain Packages by Package Combination (ttaad1121m000) session, include the new package VRC in all the package combinations that will use the functionality from the Business Object Documents:



Note: If you do not require SOA functionality, do not include the bo package in package combinations.

- 5 Save the modification. To rebuild the data dictionary, start the Rebuild DD option from the Specific menu or click the Rebuild DD button.
- 6 Start the Maintain Update VRC's (ttpmc2140m000) session. Create a new Update VRC 2.0U b4 bo. Set the Base VRC to 2.0 b4 bo. An example of the new update package VRC is as follows:



After you have completed the process, you must log on again.
